Fall Meeting Saturday, September 17 at 2:00 pm

WHO WAS PETER DEMENS? Peter Demens was an amazing Russian who came to the United States in 1881, built the Orange Belt Railroad across the state of Florida, arriving in St. Petersburg, Florida in 1888. He is given credit for naming our city in honor of the capital of Imperial Russia. Demens is also the author of numerous articles in Russian periodical about life in America at the end of the nineteenth and the beginning of the twentieth centuries. Russian Heritage has sponsored an International Symposium (2000) and two museum exhibits (1995 and 2000) at the St. Petersburg Museum of History devoted to the life of this man.

Saturday, September 17 will be the opening of the new "Peter Demens and the Two St. Petersburgs Archive" in Special Collections at the Poynter Library at the University of South Florida St. Petersburg. With the donations by Professor Bill Parsons of collected materials and photocopies of original documents, this will be the second largest collection of Demens materials in the world, after the Library of Congress in Washington, D. C. Come to see exhibits from the "Peter Demens and the Two St. Petersburgs Arichive" at the opening on September 17.
