



Book Discussion: March 10, 2018



"A Gentleman in Moscow" has been on the Best Seller List for 47 weeks, and is being widely discussed by people interested in Russia. Set during the Soviet Union's turbulent early 1920s, A **GENTLEMAN IN MOSCOW** tells the story of Count Alexander Rostov. When he is deemed an unrepentant aristocrat by a Bolshevik tribunal, the count is sentenced to house arrest in the Metropol, a grand hotel located between the Kremlin and the Bolshoi Theater.

You may have a chance to read this novel before March 10, but even if you don't read it you can enjoy hearing a discussion led by people who have been at the Metropol Hotel, eaten at Count Rostov's restaurant, or enjoyed the atmosphere of the Kremlin and the Bolshoi Theater. We invite you to meet Marvin Kalb, renowned journalist and author of "The Year I Was Peter the Great: 1956 - Khrushchev, Stalin's Ghost, and a Young American in Russia." In 1956, Kalb was a young diplomatic attaché at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow, where he observed this tumultuous year that foretold the end of Soviet communism three decades later. Fluent in Russian, a doctoral candidate at Harvard, he went where few other foreigners would dare go, listening to Russian students secretly attack communism and threaten rebellion against the Soviet system, traveling from one end of a changing country to the other and, thanks to his diplomatic position, meeting and talking with Khrushchev, who playfully nicknamed him Peter the Great.
