New Russian National Anthem Combines Soviet Melody With New Words

On December 30, 2000 President Vladimir Putin approved the new words for the Russian National Anthem. It had been decided earlier in December by the Russian Parliament that the new anthem would use the tune of melody of the former Soviet National Anthem with new words. The text below shows the new words in Russian and in English translation. The Russian text is taken from the newspaper Rossiiskaya Gazeta for January 4, 2001.
