

First Night Celebration in St. Petersburg Starts Festivities

December 31 is always a big celebration in St. Petersburg, Florida! FIRST NIGHT is a New Year's Eve celebration which this year includes the creation of a Quilt Project "Bridging the Two St. Petersburgs" which will be presented to St. Petersburg, Russia, the painting of a mural on the Florida International Museum (Third Street Side) by muralists Robert and Cathy Schott commemorating the birthdays of the two St. Petersburgs, and numerous references to the twin birthday celebrations. Heavy rains hampered the First Night activities, but the projects will go on.

Student Ambassadors Kate & Dasha Arrive from Moscow

The first contingent of Student Ambassadors will spend much of January in the Tampa Bay area, visiting schools here, and serving as ambassadors of the Russian language and culture. Kate and Dasha are students of the Obninsk School near Moscow, and they will visit about a dozen schools and colleges in January. > If you are planning to visit Russia or just interested in dearning about it. this class is for you. Holena Kazakoya, former journalist from Moscow, will share her knowledge and passion about Russian culture and language. Films and handouts will give a chance to understand more about Russia's life, art, religion, and traditions. A textbook, Russian in 10 Minutes a Day, will help you to "master" Russian language in 10 easy and enjoyable classes.

UPCOMING EVENTS

"St. Petersburg — Санкт Петербург: Namesake Cities." This exhibit at the St. Petersburg Museum of History (335 2nd Avenue NE) shows the similarities and differences between the two St. Petersburgs and their founders, and shows the relationships between the two cities in the past quarter century leading up to the present joint celebration of the anniversaries of the two cities in 2003. Russian Heritage is a major sponsor of this exhibit. The exhibit opens in January at the museum, and will be shown in several other places in the city during the year.

"Photographs of St. Petersburg, Russia." The photographs in this exhibit are part of the collection of photographs from Mayor Anatoly Sobchak of St. Petersburg, Russia. The exhibit was first presented in the spring of 2001 at St. Petersburg College. If you missed it in 2001, you will want to see it now. It is well worth a second visit in this special anniversary year. The exhibit opens in January in the Music Center Gallery of the St. Petersburg College Gibbs Campus (6605 5th Avenue North).

Eckerd Senior College is sponsoring a number of programs on Russia this spring. The first is a Winter Festival program "Russian Day" on Friday, January 10 from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. Activities include ballet performances by Andrei Ustinov and Elena Martinson, a presentation of Peggy Newton's Samoyed Dogs, an appearance by "Catherine the Great" (this will amaze you), and other surprises. The entrance fee of \$5.00 (in advance), or \$8.00 at the door, includes refreshments. Call 864-7600.

On February 14 the Senior College is presenting an entire day of educational programming on "The Romance of Russia," with special sessions on Russian music, history, literature, art, including breakfast and lunch for a fee of \$85 (Russian Heritage members will get a \$15 discount on this program).
