# Russian Heritage Ambassador Exchange Program Student Musicians form St. Petersburg, Russia

Kristina Miller and Ekaterina Frolova from the Special Music School-Lyceum of the Rimsky-Korsakov St. Petersburg Conservatory will be visiting St. Petersburg, Florida during the first two weeks in March, sponsored by Russian Heritage and Eckerd College. They will be performing on March 7 in Largo and at Eckerd College on March 13. They will also be appear at St. Petersburg College and Gibbs High School and will meet with the Pinellas Youth Orchestra. Russian Heritage is excited to have student musicians of this quality visiting our city. #### KRISTINA MILLER (piano)

Kristina was born in 1968 and began her piano studies at the Music School in the city of Ulyanovsk on the Volga. Since 2000 she has studied in the Special Music School-Lycem of the Rimsky-Korsakov St. Petersburg Conservatory with Professor Rubina.

She is a prize-winner at the Mravinsky International Competition "Young Talents", and at youth festivals in Volgograd and Ulyanovsk. She has performed as a soloist with the symphony orchestras of Volgograd, Ulyanovsk, and Bremen, Germany.

Her extensive repertoire includes many solo pieces of different composers as well as four piano concertos, including Grieg, Liszt #2, Beethoven #5, and Rachmaninov #2.

#### EKATERINA FROLOVA (violin)

Ekaterina was born in 1985 in St. Petersburg. In 1993 she entered the Special Music School-Lyceum of the Rimsky-Korsakov St. Petersburg Conservatory. Since 1995 she has been studying with Professor Kasarina.

She is the First-prize winner and the Grand Prix "Golden Bow" winner at the Second International Spor Competition for Young Violinists in Weimar, German (1998). She received the Honor Diploma at the Eighth Sibelius International Competition (2000, Helsinki). In 2002 she received the special "Hope" prize at the Twelfth Tchaikovsky Competition in Moscow, and in 2003 at the Ninth International Spor Competition in Freiburg, Germany she received First Prize.

Ekaterina has played on two Stradivarius violins, the "Empress of Russia" and the "Yusupov". She has given recitals in such countries as Austria, Germany, Holland, Poland, Finland, France, and Switzerland.

Her repertoire includes seven violin concertos, such as Tchaikovsky, Sibelius, Prokovfiev #1, Mozart #5, Mendelssohn, and others.

In 2003 Russian Heritage participated in the 28th annual SPIFFS International Folk Fair when the there was a special focus on the "Two St. Petersburgs" and the celebrations of the two anniversaries of these special cities. This year Russian Heritage will again participate in the 29th Folk Fair, which will have as its theme, "Legends, Myths, and Folklore".

This year the Folk Fair will take place at the PINELLAS EXPO CENTER, 10601 US HWY 19 North, in Pinellas Park. On Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday the Folk Fair is open to students from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The Exhibits are open to the General Public at the following times:
