Poetry Reading: Yevgeny Yevtushenko, acclaimed Russian poet, filmmaker and political activist, will read his poetry at The Studio@620, located in downtown St. Petersburg at 620 First Avenue South. Tickets are \$13 for adults and \$10 for students.

Yevgeny Yevtushenko, Russia's most famous living poet, was born near Irkutsk in Siberia in 1933. He was a leading member of the "new generation" of Russian poets of the 1960's, and became famous for such poems as Babi Yar and Heirs of Stalin which had political messages. He has continued to write political verse, love lyrics, and playful poems. He is also an accomplished filmmaker, directing the film Kindergarten (1984) and Stalin's Funeral (1990). He now teaches courses in Russian and European poetry and film at the University of Tulsa in Oklahoma.
