II. Program: Peter Demens is best known in Florida as a Russian immigrant who was successful as a businessman, a railroad builder, and the founder of St. Petersburg, Florida in 1888. In Russia he was known as a writer and journalist who wrote for a Russian audience about life in America under his pseudonym P.A. Tverskoy. He was greatly interested in literature, and he wrote many articles in Russian and English for newspapers and journals about Russian literature and English and American literature. Professor Parsons will speak about Demens' views on Russian literature, including his speech on Pushkin on the occasion of his 100th birthday celebration on June 6, 1899.

PUSHKIN IN LOVE

It is sometimes said that Pushkin had two passions poetry and women. He was a well-known "ladies man" and he kept a
"Don Juan's list" of 37 names who inspired him, and/or were
seduced by him. The list included three Anna's and two Natalya's
(Anna Kern, Anna Olenina, and Anna Wulf and Natalya Kochubei and
Natalya Goncharova, his wife). He wrote many love poems to these
women, perhaps the most famous being dedicated to Anna Kern:

"Я помню чудное мгновенье" (I remember a wondrous moment) Не also created a wonderful picture of a Russian woman in the

character of Tatyana in Evgeny Onegin.
