RUSSIAN FILMS AT TWO FESTIVALS IN NOVEMBER

Tchaikovsky-Pushkin Film Festival at Eckerd College: November 9

An afternoon and evening of films featuring Russian culture through the music and poetry of Peter Tchaikovsky and Alexander Pushkin. All three film experiences are shown in Dendy Auditorium at Eckerd College. They are free and open to the public.

2:00 pm: A film collage on the life and works of Peter Tchaikovsky. Highlights

from the Russian film "Tchaikovsky" and the British film "Music Lovers".

4:00 pm: "Eugene Onegin." Russian Language Film of the Opera by Tchaikovsky based on the Pushkin poem. (with English subtitles)

7:00 pm: "The Queen of Spades." Russian Language Film of the Opera by Tchaikovsky based on the short story by Pushkin.

THE RUSSIAN CYRILLIC ALPHABET

The Russian Cyrillic Alphabet is based on an alphabet invented in the ninth century by the Slavic monk St. Cyril, hence the name Cyrillic. Many of the letters were derived from the Greek. The letters in the chart above were prepared by Irene Chitikov during the time of the "Treasures of the Czars" Exhibit and show the Russian letters in order.

The words on page 4 introduce the Russian letters by showing Russian words can be recognized because they look like English words. Begin with "MAMA" (mama) and go down the first column adding a new Russian letter each time a number is given. The first new letter is "p" which in English is "r", so the second word on the list is "theater" followed by "camera". It's like a game. Yo should be able to figure out the first two columns in less than an hour. Obviousl those who speak and read Russian won't need this exercise, but it may be very helpful for you to give it to someone wanting to learn the alphabet.



MILLENNIUM RUSSIAN NEW YEAR'S GALA

Our fourth Russian New Year's Celebration for the new millennium promises to be the best ever. Featured at this year's Gala will be world famous Russian poet Yevgeny Yevtushenko and Xenia Woyevodsky, Executive Director of the Tolstoy Foundation. You will be receiving a special invitation to this event scheduled for Friday, January 14, 2000 at the St. Petersburg Yacht Club, but mark your calendars now.

PETER DEMENS DAYS IN MAY 2000

Plans are moving forward for the PETER DEMENS DAYS for early May, 2000 in connection with the 150th Anniversary of his birth on May 1, 1850.

- 1. The exhibit planned on Peter Demens in Russia (both for the cities of TVER and ST. PETERSBURG) is now being prepared. We have committed to help support this exhibit and have raised almost half of the money needed. We need about \$1100 more to meet our goal of \$2500, which Russian Heritage member John Galbraith has agreed to match. Can you help us meet this goal, especially now that Russian Heritage has been declared a non-profit organization by the IRS (see article on opposite page).
- Your executive officers met with Mayor David Fischer to explore the process of creating an historical marker about Peter Demens and his achievements to be placed in Demens Landings.
- 3. The idea of a symposium on Peter Demens for May 1st is moving forward. Two scholars from Russia, including Inna Povedskaya, the curator of the Russian exhibit, have agreed to come, and we are expecting the participation of several more specialists on Demens to be involved.
- 4. Sam Bond, Executive Director of the St. Petersburg Museum of History, has agreed to support our efforts to recognize Demens, and to arrange a small exhibit devoted to him in May.

RUSSIAN HERITAGE NOW OFFICIALLY NON-PROFIT

During the summer Bruce Beery, treasurer, filed with the IRS to obtain non-profit status for Russian Heritage. At the September meeting of Russian Heritage it was announced that this non-profit status has been granted, so that all donations to our organization will be tax-deductible. That may help some feel more generous about supporting some of our projects, such as the Demens Exhibit described on the preceding page.
